Section 38 Commons Act 2006 Consenting Strategy

1.1 Proposed Development overview

- Pennant Walters Ltd (the Applicant) is consulting on a draft planning application to be submitted to Welsh Government for consent as a Development of National Significance (DNS). The Proposed Development, as described in the draft DNS application form, is a proposal to construct and operate a wind farm of up to four turbines (with a maximum blade tip height of 145m) and associated infrastructure including:
 - Access works new access off the existing road together with new and improved internal wind farm tracks off the main internal road;
 - Crane pads at each turbine location;
 - Turbine foundations;
 - Underground power cables linking the turbines and the on-site substation; Temporary construction compounds, laydown, and storage areas; and
 - Grid connection infrastructure, including the on-site substation, control building and overhead connection into the existing overhead line, together with construction enabling works.

1.2 Secondary consents

- Section 9 of the DNS application form lists the secondary consents which can be considered by the Welsh Ministers alongside the primary DNS application.
- Under these provisions, the draft DNS application subject to consultation has identified the requirement for a secondary consent related temporary works on Mynydd Maen common under Section 38 of the Commons Act 2006.

1.3 Overview of proposed works

1.3.1 The Proposed Development seeks to minimise works by using existing roads and access tracks, where possible, However, to deliver the turbine components for Turbines 2, 3 and 4, there is a requirement to temporarily widen by 1.5m along the length of the existing road to the access track for each turbine.



1.4 Pre-application Consultation

The draft DNS application is subject to statutory pre-application consultation prior to submission. Through the consultation the Applicant is also seeking to consult on all aspects of the proposals. The consenting regime required for the temporary works is identified as being through S.38 of the Commons Act 2006.

1.5 S.38 Application Forms

The draft DNS application is supported by a draft S.38 application form, providing further detail. The draft forms are contained in **Appendix A**.
